PURPOSE:

The Georgia Building Authority's mission is to provide a clean, comfortable, and safe environment on Capitol Hill. As part of this mission, GBA is implementing health screening measures for all buildings on Capitol Hill and 2 Peachtree during the ongoing public health emergency. These measures follow CDC and GDPH recommended guidelines for public health.

The measures include requiring all visitors, tenants, state officials and employees to self-screen and not enter buildings if they are experiencing a fever, cough, or difficulty breathing. In addition, GBA has installed thermal imaging cameras in all buildings on Capitol Hill and 2 Peachtree to screen persons for elevated body temperatures of 100.4 degrees Fahrenheit or higher. The thermal imaging cameras are located only at the public entrances of the buildings, and signage will be posted advising those considering entering the buildings about their use. If the thermal imaging cameras identify a person as having an elevated temperature, that person will be advised, and security personnel will offer a secondary screening from a non-contact medical grade thermometer. If the person declines the secondary screening or if screening reflects that the person has an elevated body temperature, access to the building will be denied.

The thermal imaging cameras in public areas will not retain images, and the names of any persons denied access will not be maintained.
